



Urgent Updates

Changes going into effect January 01, 2025:

- **One Plate** - With the exception of a few commercial vehicles, only one license plate will be issued for vehicles. Please display the plate on the rear of your vehicle.
- **Central Distribution** - License plates will be mailed from a central location, using the USPS. License plates will not be available from any DMV office location. Please ensure your mailing address is up to date!
- **Decals** - We have combined the month and year into a single decal. When you receive your new decal we ask that you please remove any previously issued decals from your license plate. In addition, anytime that you are obtaining a new license plate, your initial decal will be printed on the face of the plate.
- **Flat Screen Printing** - License plates will now be flat screen printed and the characters will no longer be raised and embossed.

Additional information:

- **Registration Certificate** - When you register a vehicle you will receive a valid registration certificate that will include the license plate number. Please keep this certificate with your vehicle as a separate registration certificate will not be mailed with the license plate.
- **Readability** - Please ensure that you are not placing a cover over your license plate or using a frame that obscures or blocks the readability of the license plate number or decal.

Ongoing Reminder:

- **ID Required for Registration** - The DMV can't process a new vehicle registration without a valid government-issued ID.
